Full Text: Section 1. The following amendment to the Constitution of the State of lowa is proposed: Section 17 of Article IV of the Constitution of the State of lowa is repealed and the following adopted in lieu thereof: Sec. 17. Lieutenant governor or lieutenant governor-elect to become or act as governor or governor-elect. If there is a temporary disability of the governor, the lieutenant governor shall act as governor until the disability is removed, or the governor dies, resigns, or is removed from office. In case of the death, resignation, or removal from office of the governor, the lieutenant governor for the remainder of the term, which shall create a vacancy in the office of lieutenant governor.
